We have determined that we will not take further action on your matter for the following reason(s): The bar is not the appropriate forum to litigate issues that turned upon evidence at trial. Your remedy was to seek redress before the appellate courts or pursue a petition for writ of habeas corpus.

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There is no formal appeal process if you disagree with our decision not to initiate a formal investigation into your inquiry. The review process may take several weeks; however, the facts and circumstances alleged in your inquiry may require us to devote additional time to the review process before we can render a decision. In the event of such a second review, we will notify you in writing of our decision. Please be aware that our limited resources do not allow us to review the same information numerous times. Normally, after we have reviewed your inquiry twice, we will not continue to communicate with you about the same inquiry. Again, if you do request a second review of your inquiry, you should state new facts that you believe we may not have reviewed in our initial analysis of your inquiry. Please be brief. Merely asking us to review the same material again is not helpful in evaluating your inquiry.
